They believe, like Kepler and the greatest thinkers of the Renaissance, that music is to be constructed according to the divine Pythagorean ratios. Slowly, and with the help of his therapist girlfriend, Cecilia, Luther gropes toward resolution. The novel speaks to the universality of loss and the struggle to make sense of the nonsensical. Fans of John Kennedy Toole's *Confederacy of Dunces* will appreciate the maladroitness of the protagonist and the dark humor woven into the narrative, as will readers of Joan Didion's *The Year of Magical Thinking*, who will appreciate the artful and in-depth evocation of the process of grieving.
